Reconciliation

The Texas Election Code now requires that the presiding judge of the central counting station attest to a written reconciliation of votes and voters (127.131(f)):

- At the close of tabulation on election day
- Again after counting late mail/provisional ballots (canvass)
- For primaries conducted jointly, you may either combine parties or have a form for each
- Post completed forms on your county website
- Only required if using a central counting station



Reconciliation

Compares the number of voters who cast valid ballots with the number of votes counted by your voting system

 - Marked ballots returned by voters

- Box C minus Box F gives you the number of voters who cast valid ballots
- Then subtract box I to compare the number of valid ballots to the number of ballots counted

 J. Difference between voters and ballots (C-F-I)



- If there is a discrepancy, stop and try to identify and resolve the issue before central count adjourns
 - Positive vs. negative discrepancies
 - Positive more voters checked in than ballots counted
 - Negative more ballots counted than voters checked in
 - Verify that all media has been read
 - Use ballot transmittal form to verify the number of mail ballots



- Calculate the percentage to put the discrepancy into context
- Start with inner parentheses (Box C box F)
- Divide Box J by that number
- Multiply by 100

- Record all ballots that may be added to the count between election day and canvass
- Gives the public a clear idea of how many ballots may still be counted



Tracking down discrepancies

 Look at each row to find which category a

discrepancy is in

- Compare votes and voters for each polling location
- Think about how the parts of your voting system work together

- Box S includes any mail ballots returned as undeliverable

7 – Provisional ballots

- Provide the number of provisional check-ins that were not completed
 - Accounts for any difference in the number of provisional ballots between election day and canvass reconciliation forms



Website posting

- Post on your website along with results reports
- We recommend keeping posted for at least 22 months
